
4-H Camp is a week of fun and learning, and a chance to meet others from Culpeper, Shenandoah, and Rappahannock Counties.

Meals are provided in the dining hall. Campers are housed in dormitory style rooms with bunk beds. Choice of one roommate is guaranteed.

COST:

The cost of this 4-night residential camping experience is **\$300** and includes: lodging, 12 meals, a T-shirt, snacks, and all activities. A limited number of scholarships, based on financial need, are available. Please note that there is a \$50 fee on all returned checks.

REGISTRATION PROCESS:

Complete the attached Registration Form and <u>return it with a \$50 deposit to</u> <u>secure your spot as soon as possible (balance due by June 3).</u> You'll then be sent a packet with additional details, directions to the camp, and more forms to complete, including one for selection of classes. **Note: Registrations are accepted until camp is filled, however, classes are assigned on a first-come, first-served basis.** So, register early and return your packet of forms quickly to avoid disappointment.

REFUND POLICY:

Twenty five dollars (\$25) is a non-refundable processing fee. All refund requests must be in writing. Otherwise, a full refund will be given until June 3, 2019. After June 3, no refunds will be given except in cases of sickness (with a doctor's note) or emergency (evaluated on a case-by-case basis). Refunds for payments made to this office may take 30+ days to receive.

OPPORTUNITIES FOR TEENS:

A limited number of teens are needed to help at camp. Teens age 13 or older (as of 1/1/19) are needed to serve as a CIT (Counselor in Training) at a cost of \$255. Those age 14 or older (as of 1/1/19) may serve as a Camp Counselor at a cost of \$220. These teens have the opportunity to learn and practice leadership skills and serve their community as they have fun participating in camp activities.
